TIPS FOR YOUR TRAILBLAZER FELLOWSHIP APPLICATION



Welcome!

We are excited that you are here and considering applying for the Ann Bancroft Foundation Trailblazer Fellowship!





What is the ABF Trailblazer Fellowship?

The ABF Trailblazer Fellowship is designed for previous grantee's who are currently in grades 9-12 to re-apply for a second grant. In addition to a second grant up to \$2,500, recipients will participate in a year-long cohort experience. A **cohort** is a small group of individuals who come together regularly to learn and grow together under the guidance of an experienced facilitator. This is an interactive experience focused on mentorship and professional development.

As part of receiving the grant, full and engaged participation is expected of each applicant.



Before starting your application, you will need...

- To have already received a grant from the Ann Bancroft Foundation AND be in grades 9-12 currently.
- A dream/vision that you have for an activity, project, or goal you are striving toward.
- A mentor who will support your dream and assist with your application.
 - o A mentor can be a family friend, neighbor, a teacher, or other trusted adult
 - A mentor cannot be an immediate relative (a parent, sibling, aunt/uncle, grandparent, etc.) OR someone who works for the activity provider (such as a coach or instructor)
- An activity provider
 - This is the person who has organized the activity (a sports team, your school)
 - Think of this as the person you pay to participate in the activity



Example

- Julia loves to write, cook, and volunteer. Julia is in high school and dreams of going to college, then writing her own cookbook one day.
- Julia wants to apply for a grant to buy a camera and take photography classes for her book, then publish her own book.

Julia asks her neighbor, who has taught Julia some recipes, to be her

mentor in the application process.





When filling out your application...

- Make sure to fill out each of the prompt questions as best as you can
 - Remember, your audience does not know who you are. Make sure to include details so your audience can follow what you are telling them.
- Check your spelling and grammar Grammarly is a helpful tool
- Check for complete sentences to to ensure you finish your thoughts when responding to the questions
- Make your responses your own we want to hear from the grant applicant about their experiences and dreams
 - o Tip: Including details about yourself is how the readers get to know you as a person
- Keep the font and type-size consistent in your application
- Each question has a word-count, follow that guideline when filling out your application
- Be specific in what your activity is and why you want to be part of the fellowship experience



Example Question

Q: If you could share a meal with any individual, living or dead, who would it be and why? What would you ask them?

If I could share a meal with anyone, I would choose to have lunch with my late grandmother. My grandmother died 20 years before I was born from a sudden heart attack on her way home from a trip in Europe. All my life, I've been told I look exactly like her. I want the chance to meet her in-person, hear her stories about how she constantly challenged the status quo (she rode a motorcycle in the 1960s and 1970s). I would ask about her early life, her travel adventures, and her favorite memories. I would also ask her what she would want to see for her grandchildren.



Final tips!

- Read each question thoroughly. Make sure you answer all parts of the question in your response. Use the prompts to know what information to include in your answers.
- Consider including extra materials in your application. While not required, pictures or videos of you doing your activity, a writing sample, or anything else that helps speak to the applicant as an individual can make your application stand out and more fun to read!
- Take your time and don't rush through the application
- Make sure your mentor is fully on board before the application deadline so they can complete their part. Their responses matter!
- Most importantly, be yourself!




How to Find the Application

Step 1: Registering an Account


- Make an account with WizeHive to log in and start the application
- Note: If you are able to, please use a personal email address instead of a school email address. Sometimes we are unable to contact applicants based on privacy settings with the school. Email is our primary form of communication, so we must have a valid email address you check regularly.





Step 1: Registering an Account


- Create your account using an email address you have access to.
- Add the required information then click "Create Account"
- Wait for the confirmation code from WizeHive





Step 2 – Create your Profile/Eligibility Quiz


- This is the dashboard to start a grant application
- Create your profile first by clicking "Get Started"
- Complete the Eligibility check to start your application





Step 3


- Until you complete the Eligibility Quiz, you can only view the application questions
- Questions can be viewed for phases one and two on the left side of the portal
- Click "Start" to begin a section or "Edit" to resume the section





Step 4


- Now you will start filling out your application!
- Make sure to "Save Draft and Exit Section" before you finish.
- Click "Next" to move to the next section
- Once all tasks are filled out, you will be able to "Submit" your application on the upper rightside
- Your application must be fully submitted by the deadline.
 There are no extensions





Step 5

- Review your application and submit!
- Review all your answers; check for spelling and grammar errors, and overall completeness.
- Ask your mentor, friends, parents, or a trusted adult for feedback on your application, if you'd like
- When when completed & reviewed, submit your application!
